Call to Order/ Roll Call At 4:00pm

Presentations

Chair Welcome. Lucia Rodriguez thanked Tony Abbate for his generous book gift to all board members. Lucia welcomed Francisco Rivera to the HUF Board of Directors; she shared highlights from his personal and professional life.

Governance Committee—Presented by Anthony Abbate

2021 Draft Board Officer (BOD Vote in Nov or Dec). Tony reviewed the 2021 Slate of Officers from nominations and recommendations. Currently we have the Chair, John Guerrero; Chair-Elect, Christina Paradowski; Secretary, Angie Stone. Treasurer, OPEN. Scott Karlen is unable to fill that position next year and serving as Past Chair will be Lucia Rodriguez. Nominations are still open and voting for the 2021 Slate of Officers will occur either at the November or December 2020 board meetings. All those nominated have agreed to serve.

The board members were reminded to sign their **Conflict of Interest/Signature** sheets and return them to Felina Furer if they have not done so already.

2020 & 2021 Revenue & Funding Outlook: Presented by Josie Bacallao & Felipe Pinzon Josie opened the presentation. She noted that HUF's 2021 Budget is being worked on and the plan at this time is to have a completed draft for the board to review and vote on for the December 2020 Board Meeting.

Josie indicated that the focus of the presentation will be to share the scenarios embedded in the 2021 revenue projections. She also noted that this does not represent the whole budget – as expenses are not being presented at this time.

Josie also noted that HUF's approach to the 2021 budget is very conservative.

Overall Fundraising

HUF's revenue budget for 2021 will require HUF to fundraise \$1.4M (vs this year's fundraising goal of \$1.7M).

Unrestricted Funds

Of the \$1.4M in funds, \$465K are for unrestricted dollars. And to date, 50% of that unrestricted funding has already been secured for next year.

Unrestricted funding can be used for anything but in particular it goes toward funding Administration and Operations costs. Grantors are reluctant to fully fund organizations and the area where they most often not fund is the administrations/operations area.

It is in the unrestricted funding area where Board Members play a key role. For 2021 we will need to raise \$465k through the Annual Campaign, Circle of Friends and Major Gifts. Variance in this year and next is not material.

Program Funding

For 20212, HUF already has secured 83% of total program funding secured or \$4.4 million. In the past, HUF will have 80-83% of the funding secured, so in 2021 HUF will be at a near all-time high in pre-secured program funding. Willy Gomez asked how these numbers would change if the PPP funding is forgiven? Josie did not believe it would impact 2021. Virginia is working on another reserve account which she will review at November Finance meeting.

In addition, 50% of the Covid-19 funding secured in 2020 will be used in 2021 in the program area.

Felipe noted that we are planning to budget program expenses based on this \$4.4 budget – however, HUF has secured an additional \$800K in potential revenue that we could tap into should the pandemic allow HUF to provide more in-person services.

One Page Strategic Plan

One-Page Strategic Plan (OSPS), Josie Bacallao shared this is two pager condensed version of our 40+ page strategic plan. This is from came from the *Scale Up* book HUF uses internally with the management team. Our document was informed by HUF's Strategic Plan and the work of each HUF Board Committee. The goal is to be able to use this as HUF's annual and quarterly strategic guide with an ongoing view on where HUF's 5, 3 and 1 year goals.

Josie proceeded to review the document. Tony Abbate, suggested that we revisit the weaknesses section and change to HUF specific challenges. Steve said Advocacy is something he does not know much about wants to hear more of what we need in order to really move forward. Josie said that we would need a full time Public Policy & Advocacy staffer and some software. He wants to hear more from PP&A committee in future and what it would take to move HUF to the next level. Deborah believes we should only share, what weaknesses HUF can really improve and update. Chuck Tatelbaum believes this document has pieces to share with funders as we are not moving from crisis to crisis but that we have a thoughtful plan.

Consent Agenda

Lucia shared that she had asked Josie Bacallao to add item VI (six) to the consent agenda. Lucia wanted to memorialize in the board package the board's decision taken in June 2020 on how to handle Josie Bacallao's salary for 2021.

Steve Sampier motioned to accept the consent agenda. Willy Gomez provided the second. Motion passed.

Cash Flows will exceed expectations in the next months because many of the large receivables listed on the Aged Receivables report from CSC are still part of August 31, 2020 receivables but are listed as paid in full between August 31, 2020 and when the financials were issued. All CSC bills have successfully been caught up as of October 15, 2021.

Mr. McGuire also acknowledged personnel issues:

- Received the senior accountant's resignation
- Received the Economic Development Finance Associate's resignation (reports to the Program Director but works extremely close with the finance area)
- Continuing to train a new Grant Accountant

MOTION:

Chuck Tatelbaum moved to accept the August 2020 financials. Mr. Guerrero provided the second. The motion passed.

Policy F122—Check Signers Policy Proposed Revision; and The Procedure for Checks Issued Greater than \$10,000:

Ms. Pfister said that the primary change was to each was to add Leessa Derrick, the Resiliency Director, as a signatory. All other controls recently updated prior to this revision remain intact.

MOTION:

Chuck Tatelbaum moved to accept the amended Policy F122 and Procedure for Signing Checks greater than \$10K. Mr. Guerrero provided the second. The motion passed.

Workers Comp (WC) Audit Update and Air Quality Improvements:

Ms. Derrick updated the committee on her work with HUF's WC insurance carrier on recoding employees to reduce the cost of our annual worker's compensation rate. Currently, employees are all classified in the highest rate and that by negotiating this recoding on 45% of 225 staff HUF could potentially bring the cost down substantially. HUF is waiting to hear back from the insurance carrier.

Pandemic Safety Update

Steps and procedures implemented to improve air quality:

- Improved quality of air filters to the best the HUF air conditioning system could handle
- Increased cleaning protocols
- Added UV bulbs in the AC system
- Will be leaving doors to preschool open for improved air circulation
- Ms. Derrick is looking into air purifiers
- The cost for these improvements would by around \$4,500

Strategic Goals Timeline:

Ms. Bacallao reviewed the Finance Committee's Strategic Plan Goals. The committee will need to review and update these for the January 2021 board meeting. Committee members will deter which tasks to prioritize, pause or not complete and lastly which new ones need to be added due in response to COVID-19. Committee members were asked to review the list to see if in-light of COVID-19 there are additional items that need to be added to the list.

When asked, Mr. Pinzon said the biggest risk to the program area is staff contracting COVID-19.

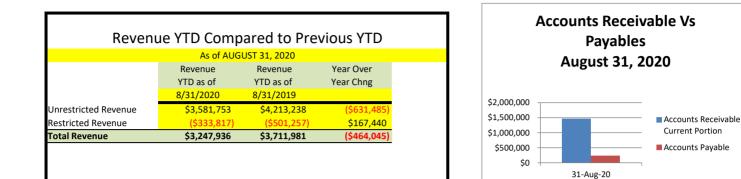

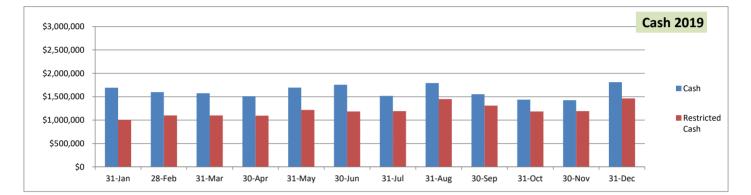

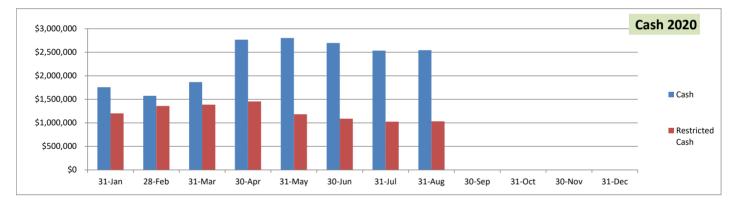

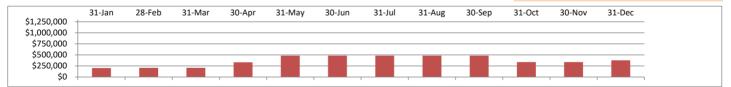


August 31, 2020 Dashboard

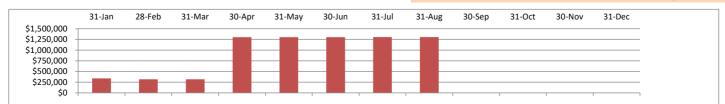




Line of Credit Usage 2019

- 5) **Fundraising opportunities via Social Media for Board of Directors by Lucia Rodriguez.** Board members are looking for fun and creative ways to fundraise on social media and assist creating the opportunities. Lucia suggested to have children of board members be participants of the fundraiser, where the children can perform by showcasing a skill, such a playing an instrument. Discussions

1) Approve July 2020 Meeting Minutes

Dan Schevis motioned to approve minutes. Megan Turetsky provided the second. Motion passed.

2) News and Updates. Presented by Josie Bacallao

Actions since last meeting, Josie reviewed what has happened since the last meeting this summer. Josie was invited to join the Children Thrive Action Network (a new national advocacy group supporting children in mixed status families). We have had several calls to action this summer. The Children of Immigrant Families Coalition's Steering Committee (new leadership for the coalition) met recently to revise the mission, job description for steering committee members, sub-committee's and we have a consultant assisting us as well. We received several grants one of which will support SNAP (food stamps) direct service work as well as, policy/advocacy.

3) 2021 Legislative Agenda

Next year the legislature will meet March-May 2021. We are drafting a draft of our 2021 policy platform and using the same approach as in previous years, i.e., adopting as our own policy items form a variety of local, state and national partners that align with our mission and policy priorities. We are reviewing our current Covid-19 platform and what rolls over from 2020 into 2021. We foresee continued employment challenges throughout 2021 as well as the continued focus on basic needs which will be much more acute for immigrant and underserved populations. Miami-Dade and Broward United Ways are joining and all others in Florida are coming together for one platform led by their Tallahassee policy lobbyist. We are having bi-weekly meetings with all the Florida UnidosUS affiliates to share challenges, solutions and policy platforms. We will have agenda a first draft of the 2021 platform for this committee for review and discuss and hope to have it finalized by December.

Commissioner Julie Fishman said this next (Florida) session will be very different as the state will be looking to cut the budget. It will hurt those that we serve, the poor and education overall. We will be playing a lot of defense with next year's budget. Funding for affordable housing will also continue to be an issue.

Robby Holroyd shared he was with the incoming speaker this past week, and the state is anticipating and planning for a \$2 billion shortfall for the year (started Oct. 1, 2020). There is \$3 billion in reserve which will be cut to \$1 billion. Expenditures due to Covid-19 the state used the Cares Act. The state is waiting to learn more about the flexibility of the Cares Act funds to close the short falls. If allowed to use those funds, that would close the remaining gaps. This election will determine a lot of what Florida does to expand Medicaid, etc. One of the big



conversations he is hearing is on the workforce development side, Universities are going to get the biggest slash in education area cuts. Reallocate money to state college system for work force development. Push for 60% of adults to get national certification or a college degree, serious resources would need to be put behind work force education in order for that to happen. He hopes social services will be aligned with workforce. It will be a challenging year, but getting behind workforce education he recommends adding to HUF's legislative agenda. Take a look at children's health insurance, which may also be a place to make a huge difference. When things are going well you do not want to rock the boat, now the boat is rocking so we might as well take an innovative approach. There is also a strong appetite for programs and policy changes that are not asking for more money, to reallocate to get better outcomes within social services, to maximize the return.

Megan Turetsky said CSC platform is focused on 80% around 2Gen work which they are continue to develop. Josie asked to be kept in the conversation. CSC is aligned with state's Children's

Council, new CEO Michelle Watson. Vance Aloupis is a champion for 2Gen and education and is re-running for re-election.

We may be looking at a virtual conversations with legislators and their staff members in the future. Robby said to continue to educate and involve other UnidosUS partners in the state. Julie said we will not know what bills we are going to be fighting *against* until after the election, we will need a solid strategy of potential harmful legislation. We have to keep that in mind looking for hurtful bills that do harm to our constituency.

Dr. Maria Bernal, they are working on coming back in the Spring and many decisions are currently being made. Broward College is currently remote and may require one in person class next year. Enrollment has dropped significantly. She shared HUF's, Learning Café cohort they are learning the student's needs and where the gaps are and the next steps in the process. There are students now looking for certificates for when the job market does open up. Community outreach and academic marrying is what Broward College is looking at. Registration cannot begin until they have decided class format, Dr. Bernal will have more to report at the next meeting. In an FIU study, Josie shared 42% of layoff will result in permanent job loss as the job market will significantly shift. Josie will share that whitepaper with committee.

Robby shared that the marine industry is a huge economic driver too, Broward College has done a fantastic job of creating good paying jobs in that industry. Josie asked the committee to share legislative representatives HUF should be reaching out to.

Carolina Cardozo asked about a large distribution that was supposed to be distributed to county's and cities. Josie shared it is being distributed the \$100 million to cities. Broward has \$40 million still to spend which is going into PPE and being spent slowly. Broward County had \$350M to distribute overall.
