We, the undersigned, residents of the State of Florida,

being twenty one (21) years or more of age, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation (not for profits) under the statutes of the State of Florida.

The name of the corporation shall be Hispanic Unit of Florida, Inc.

LOCATION

The location of the principal office of Hispanic Unity of Florida, Inc. shall be 1341 S.W. 6 Terrace, city of Deerfield Beach, County of Broward, State of Florida.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Hispanic Unity of Florida shall be as follows:

- To provide help and guidance to the hispanic residents of the State of Florida and their familie in order for them to adjust better to the american culture in general and that of the State of Florida in specific.
- 2. To promote, develop and conduct human service programs
- To act as liaison between the Hispanic Community of the State of Florida and government and private human service agencies.

The agency's first Financial Literacy course gives clients the knowledge and skills to take control of their economic future.




Growth of ESOL drives expansion. HUF purchases second building near administrative office.


